## Level 3 BTEC Extended Certificate in Uniformed Protective Services (equivalent to 1 A level)

This one year course is suitable for learners wishing to gain skills and knowledge to apply for a uniformed service career (subject to meeting service application and selection standards) or progressing to a variety of Higher Education Courses at University.

The units that may be studied are:

Each student is required to pay £50 to cover the cost of residential and day visits

The preferred 3<sup>rd</sup> block option for this course is Criminology subject to entry requirements. However, 1 Block A level courses are available should you prefer.

## Level 3 BTEC Diploma in Uniformed Protective Services (equivalent to 2 A levels)

This two year course follows on from Year 1 and is suitable for learners wishing to gain skills and knowledge to apply for a uniformed service career (subject to meeting service application and selection standards) or progressing to a variety of Higher Education Courses at University.

The units that may be studied are:

#### **BTEC ASSESSMENT**

These courses consist of a mixture of practical and classroom activities and will have a variety of assessment activities, most of which is coursework.

Coursework includes presentation, reports, practical observations and peer assessments.

Level 3 assessment is by the submission of coursework for most units, with one unit each year externally examined.

#### **ENTRY AND SKILL REQUIREMENTS**

- GCSE Maths and English at Grade 4 or above
- Excellent attendance and punctuality
- The ability to meet strict deadlines
- To work as an individual or part of a team
- The ability to lead groups of students during tasks
- Good levels of fitness
- Ability to participate in physical activity and expeditions
- Ability to participate in land and water-based outdoor activities
- An interest in joining a Uniformed Service

You may also re-sit GCSE Maths and English as required.

You will have the opportunity to take part in the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme or other College enrichment programmes.

### **PROGRESSION**

Former students have progressed to: Police, FARS, Army, Navy, Airforce and Royal Marines.

Many students at the end of the second year progress to a variety of HE courses for example: Paramedic, Police, FARS and Criminology degrees.
