I would like to share some recent activities and provide you with some useful information.

Year 13:

January was a busy month for all working towards the university application (UCAS) January deadline. This was the 'equal consideration' deadline, meaning that all applications received by this date will be considered equally. If the deadline was missed and a student still wants to apply this can be done by applying as a **late applicant** (up until 30th June). This will mean that when the on- time applications have been sorted late applicants will be considered for any spaces left.
