UCAS: January continued to be a busy month for all working towards the university application deadline. This was the 'equal consideration' deadline, meaning that all applications received by this date will be considered equally by universities. However, if a student still wants to apply this can be done by applying as a late applicant (up until 30th June). Year 12:

Prior to half term all year 12 students attended two 'Where Next?' Sessions. The first focusing on 'Alternatives to University', including apprenticeships (during National Apprenticeship Week) and the second about 'Higher Education'. The feedback from students following these sessions was overwhelmingly positive.

First year students have been given the option to go to the **Hereford and Worcester UCAS Exhibition** taking place on Thursday 24th January at Worcester University. Letters were given out during these sessions to be returned with a parent/carer signature (£2.50 coach fee/students in receipt of bursary free). Places are limited but if you didn't receive a letter, it may still be possible to attend - speak to the Students Services Coordinator (Student Services Reception).

Foundation Year:

We are continuing to work closely with foundation students on a one- to- one basis delivering careers guidance interviews assisting students to make a suitable progression choice. Additionally, we are excited about a trip that we are taking foundation students on next Friday (11th March) to the **UK University & Apprenticeship Search Fair** at Edgbaston Stadium.
