Key Concepts: Auteur Theory

The idea of the auteur as a critical approach derives from an earlier period of Film Studies when critics aimed to demonstrate that films are 'authored' by individuals, most obviously the film's director, rather than being generic products.

Today, the concept of the auteur can be applied to a film or group of films in order to identify and explain its distinctive characteristics, arguing that these derive from a principal creative individual (most commonly the director, but it may also include cinematographers, performers or institutions).

Learners study the following:

- How auteurs, through the imprint of their 'signature' features, can make a significant impact on a film's messages and values.
- How auteurs determine the look and style of a film in relation to the collaborative approach to film production within Hollywood cinema
