<p>Top strategies for final exam preparation (students should already have consolidated their course notes and flash cards)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Revise in small chunks for the vocabulary/ test yourself in writing as well as orally/ get someone to test you. Use or make quizlets. • Do mind maps for ideas, opinions and cultural facts to prepare for the oral exam • Record yourself (IRP/ oral cards) and listen to it afterwards • Write detailed plans or full lengths essays for the Film and Literary essays (list of essays at the back of the booklets) • Do and re-do Past Papers from Edexcel. Use other exam boards too (AQA/ Eduqas) • Do 2 translations a week from the pack of translations/ check the answers/ note and learn unknown vocabulary • Listen to some French regularly (See radio and TV links on Teams in “ How to improve” channel, such as TV5 Monde) • Read French news articles online regularly / borrow novels from the LRC • Watch the grammar revision videos for more complex grammatical concepts (videos on Teams in “how to improve “ channel) and do the exercises on the Dynamic Learning Grammar worksheets (Look in “ How to improve” channel on Teams). D • Conjugate verbs in all tenses using the verb grid templates
